





A Spring Garden

planting our seeds, so we can have a big beautiful garden!		









How To Draw A Bee






1. Draw the head

Make a circle however large you would like your bee's head to be




2. Draw the body

Make a large "U" under the head




3. Draw the stripes

Draw 2 lines going across the middle of the body to make a stripe




4. Draw the face and antennae

Draw the eyes by making two small dots. Then create a smiley face by drawing a small "U" under the eyes. Draw two lines on top of the head with small circles on top for the antennae




6. Draw the top wings

Make the top set of wings by drawing half of a heart on each side. Start just below the eyes and connect at the top of the stripe



7. Draw the lower wings and stinger

Make the bottom set of wings by making a large backwards "C". Start at the middle of the top wing and connect to the bottom of the body. Draw a small "V" at the bottom for the stinger

A: 16th Century


